TECHNICAL HIGH ANGLE ROPE RESCUE AWARENESS (OVER THE BANK) This course will standardize embankment rescue & provide the foundation skills for students who would like to move into the operations & technician level courses. This course includes: ropes & knots, equipment familiarization, basic anchoring & rigging systems, patient packaging & low/angle embankment rescue scenarios. Students will be given a written & practical evaluation. This course is an accreditation path by ProBoard and IFSAC in compliance with NFPA 1006. **MUST SUPPLY SUITABLE FOOTWEAR.** ~ This course qualifies departments to apply for PEP response numbers.

STRATEGIES & TACTICS ADVANCED: This 2 day interactive workshop is an ideal building block for aspiring fire fighters and an essential review for experienced incident commanders. Incident command requires background knowledge and application of skills in all phases of strategy and tactics – knowing what needs to be done as well as the how it is going to be accomplished. An important element of this workshop is the use of case studies based on actual incidents to show the applications of the theories to real world situations.

- Organize the learning and environment so that learning is maximized,
- Meet the record-keeping requirements of authority having jurisdiction.

HAZMAT EMERGENCY RESPONSE OPERATIONS: Through lectures, classroom & field exercises, students learn techniques to recognize, identify & assess degrees of risk involved with hazardous materials & their containers, appropriate safety precautions, selection of appropriate personal protective clothing, safe defensive control techniques to protect people & the environment. Through field scenarios, students employ classroom learning to respond to simulated incidents wearing all appropriate protective equipment & successfully demonstrate response management, & establishment of decontamination areas & procedures. This course is accredited by ProBoard and IFSAC in compliance with NFPA 472. **STUDENT MUST SUPPLY OWN TURNOUT GEAR.**

Through interactive exercises the course will improve the effectiveness, efficiency and safety of the emergency personal operating in an unpredictable emergency environment while at the same time, recognizing & understanding Regulations, Standards and Rules of the WorkSafeBC, NFPA and the Occupational Safety and Health Association (OSHA).

LIVE FIRE 1: A fire fighter completing Level 1 will have the appropriate mix of theoretical knowledge & practical skills & techniques to function effectively & safely as an integral member of a fire fighting team when engaged in fire suppression activities. Participants will develop the flowing practical skills & techniques for structural fires, interior/exterior attacks & ventilation: Class A materials – exterior, combustible liquid, vehicle fires, storage containers, class A materials – interior. This course is in conformance with NFPA 1001. Achieves Module 8, Level I Practical. **STUDENT MUST SUPPLY OWN TURNOUT GEAR INCLUDING BALACLAVA.**
