DO NOT CROWD THE PLOW.

- Use low-beam headlights when approaching or following Snow Removal Equipment.
- Don't shovel snow from sidewalks and driveways onto the street.
- Keep your distance, give Snow Removal Equipment room to work - Stay two or three car lengths behind the plow.
- Do not pass the plow.

SNOW REMOVAL EQUIPMENT SAFETY

- Children should never build snow forts or tunnels along the roadway. These can collapse or be pushed down by snow plows.
- Adults and Children should ensure they are visible to all Snow Removal Equipment. Day and night.
- Adults and Children should keep well away from snow blowers and plows.
